

If someone asks you to think of different ways computers are used, you probably don't think to mention that they are used to drive cars. When computers were first introduced, probably no one realized how they would change the future of car design. Today's cars already use many applications of computer technology. Tomorrow's cars will go even further and your car may do part of the driving itself.

The first computer parts to be installed in cars were added in the mid-1970s when they were used in radios. Right now, most uses involve functional operations. Under the hood, the transmission and the engine are controlled by computers. They also look after music and climate control inside the car. Outside, they can monitor tire pressure and emissions for pollution control. They can even unlock your doors without a key and provide protection from thieves.

The future holds many more options. Some of them are quite expensive and may not be developed if the public feels that the cost exceeds the value of the option. However, the public has been quick to ask for air-bag systems and anti-lock brake systems. Another innovation uses satellites. The system displays information on a screen on your dashboard that tells you where you are. You can enter an address and your car then shows you a map of the area and speaks to you, telling you where to turn. But would you pay \$2,000 for an on-board navigation system?

There are also radar systems that can detect other vehicles and objects nearby. Sometimes drivers don't take the time to look and see if it is safe to proceed. This system scans the area around a person's car and warns if there is danger – another car or even a child. Perhaps a future development will be a system to stop you from changing lanes on the highway if there is another vehicle beside you, even if you don't see it. And your cruise control may become more powerful. Using lasers, it could be designed to adjust the car's speed so that there is always a safe distance between you and the next car.

Advertising is the communication relayed from companies to persuade an audience to purchase their products. TV communication is usually through various forms of paid media – TV and radio commercials, print ads billboards and more recently product placement. Ads are placed where advertisers believe they'll reach the largest, most relevant audience. Modern advertising was created with the innovative techniques introduced with tobacco ads, in the 1920's. In 2014, a study conducted over 7 years found that the TV commercial is still the most effective mass-market advertising format.

Breast Cancer

During a general physical examination, every woman should have a complete breast examination. Breast cancer is the most common cancer in women. Because growths are also possible in men's breast, doctors should perform a breast examination on all patients.

The doctor begins the examination with the patient in a sitting position. The doctor asks the patient to hold her arms at her sides while he inspects the breasts for symmetry, contour, masses, and retracted areas. The doctor then asks the patient to raise her arms above her head while he palpates the lymph nodes under her arms.

Next the doctor asks the patient to lie down and place her hand under her head on the first side to be examined. The doctor may ask you to place a small pillow or folded towel under the patient's shoulder blade on the same side. This procedure allows the breast tissue to flatten evenly against the chest wall, permitting easier palpation. The doctor ten palpates the breast in a circular, systematic manner to check for lumps, examines the areola and nipple, and then repeats the procedure on the other side.

When examining male patients, the doctor palpates the patient's breasts and lymph nodes in the same manner as he does with his female patients. The doctor also checks the breasts of his male patients for lesions or swelling.
